<b>3.Canter</b> Rhythm, looseness, suppleness, natural balance, uphill tendency, ability to bend the joints of the hindquarters		*(10)
<b>4.Submissiveness</b> Contact, straightness, obedience, responsiveness to the aids of the rider		*(10)
<b>5.General Impression</b> As a young dressage horse, standard of training on the basis of the "scale of training" according to age		*(10)
