Interschool Championships 2024

2024 Interschool Championships will be hosted by Equestrian Queensland in 2024 (Dates TBC), held at Tamworth.

In May 2024 ETAS in conjunction with the Sporting Committees will call for applications from Primary and Secondary Students to be considered for a place on the 2024 Tasmanian Team.

For those who attended in previous years, it has been a highlight of their year.

Membership Requirements

To be considered for a place on the Tasmanian Team you need to obtain qualifying rides as a rider/horse combination in your chosen sport/s at the level you wish to complete or above. All classes entered must be EA open (Official)*.

To obtain qualifying rides the rider **must hold the following at the time of the qualifying event**:

- **ETAS Membership** – participant or competitor depending on the level you are riding at the time of the qualifying event. Please note, that if selected for the National team a competitor membership is required
- **Interschool Licence** - at the time of the qualifying event. The Interschool licence is linked to the rider, not horse.

No event can be used as a qualifier without holding ETAS membership or an Interschools Licence. The Interschool licence can be purchased at the time of membership renewal/sign up, or via your MYEA Online portal under merchandise at a fee of \$38.50.

For certain competition levels, your horse will also require a **Full Horse Registration** and a **Sports Licence/s**. These can be obtained via your MYEA Online Portal. Please see our membership flyer to assess which membership level best suits you during qualification.

Please note competitive membership, full horse registration and competition licence/s are required for all horses and riders selected to compete at the National Championships.

Qualifying Period

Event results dated 1st May 2023 - 30th April 2024 only will be accepted as qualifiers (if the above requirements are met).

Discipline Qualifying Events and Requirements

The following sections detail the requirements, please note these are the **minimum requirements**, you are encouraged to record and submit all your results.

*One class allowance for eventing



All Dressage Tasmania events have the option for you to select that you are riding Interschool allowing your ride to become a qualifier.

Required Results

The combination must achieve a **minimum of three tests** in open (official) classes obtained at a **minimum of two different events** with qualifying scores of:

- Preliminary-Novice 64%
- Elementary and upwards 62%



JUMPING

All Jumping Tasmania competitions can be used as qualifiers as long as you have an Interschool licence at the time of the competition.

Result Requirements

The combination must have competed at a **minimum of three (3) Jumping Tasmania or Agricultural Society competitions** at the nominated height to achieve:

- TWO results with no faults
- ONE result with a maximum of 4 jumping penalties



COMBINED TRAINING

Combinations must compete as a combination at **three qualifying results** at the qualification level for Nationals, or higher to be considered. The following qualifications are required as a minimum:

Qualifying Events

- ONE X TEA Combined Training Championship, **PLUS**
- TWO x Dressage/Jumping Results from TEA ODE or Combined Training Qualification Events.

Result Requirements

- THREE x Dressage results over 65%
- THREE x Jumping results with no more than 8 jumping penalties

Consideration may be given to other EA Dressage or EA Jumping performances at Official Competitions if insufficient CT competitions are held. Riders must submit all qualification results at the time of entry to be considered. A panel of selectors will then be appointed to select the team



EVENTING

Combinations must compete as a combination at **three qualifying results** at the qualification level for Nationals, or higher to be considered. The following qualifications are required as a minimum:

Qualifying Events

- ONE x TEA ODE Championship, plus TWO x Official TEA ODEs
OR
- ONE x TEA ODE Championship, ONE x TEA official ODE, ONE x Pony Club Trials (Being held March 2024).

Result Requirements

- TWO must be clear of cross country jumping penalties
- ONE may have no more than 20 cross country jumping penalties
- ALL qualifying events must have no more than 12 jumping penalties



SHOW HORSE

All ETAS Show Horse events have the option for you to select that you are riding Interschool allowing you entry to become a qualifier.

Required Results (Please see the next page for Working Hunter)

- Combinations must achieve points at official Show Horse events from 1st Place [10 points], second place [7 points], 3rd place [5 points].
- Champion will be 12 points and Reserve 10 points.

This is across all pony/galloway/hack sections and riding classes. Points will be calculated at the end of the season for team placement.

A Champion at the ETAS Horse of The Year event is an automatic qualifier for Interschool Nationals.

Working Hunter

It is recognised Working Hunter classes are not currently being conducted in Tasmania, therefore, to qualify for the Working Hunter Classes for Australian Interschool Championships combinations are required to:

Win Champion or Reserve Champion Show Hunter Section at a Royal Show, ETASHorse of the Year, **or** an Etas Show Horse Event with Interschool classes.

Plus

Complete TWO clear jumping rounds at 65cm **or** above at an Open (official) EA jumping competition or EvA Combined Training class.

Preparing to Apply

Riders are encouraged to keep a record of **all their rides** noting class, %, placings, penalties/faults, event date and name, as these will all be required at the time of application and will be checked.
